Since April 17<sup>th</sup> is also Easter this year, the cruise is moved back to Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>. We will meet at the Wine Center on Columbia Drive in Kennewick. The route will go through Pasco to US-12, then south on US-12 and US-730 through Wallula Gap to Umatilla, then up I-82 to Kennewick. It ends at The Dugout on Hildebrand. Additional details will be discussed at the April 19<sup>th</sup> meeting.

## MARCH 15<sup>TH</sup> MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Roseanne Davis at 7:00 p.m. Brad Nomburger was present as a visitor and prospective new member. Introductions were made. Julie Schwartz moved to have the February 15<sup>th</sup> meeting minutes approved as printed in the newsletter; John Airoidi seconded the motion. The minutes were approved.

### OLD BUSINESS:

1. Julie and Marv Mabrey of the Tri-City Camaro Club showed the 60" by 60" blanket their club had made. The blanket is knit and of very good quality. Delivery time is 6 weeks. The minimum order is for 12. The cost is \$40 plus \$4.50 shipping. Blankets can also be made 63" by 90" for \$60 plus \$5.50 shipping. We have at least 12 members wanting one of the blankets per a show of hands.
2. Spring Show:
  - a. Leslie Streeter did a great job on the Save the Date flyers that are now being posted around the area. The flyer includes the QR code that will let people register and pay for the show and shirts on-line.
  - b. The proposed show budget was discussed. Predicted income is \$8,940; predicted expenses are \$5,477. Jim McQuown moved to have the proposed budget approved; Corky Farrell seconded. The budget was passed.
  - c. Volunteers, trophy sponsorships, and raffle prizes are needed for this show.
  - d. Jim McQuown visited the Round Table Pizza restaurant in Pasco to see if it would be suitable for show planning meetings. It has 2 good meeting rooms, but reservations are not allowed more than 2 days in advance. We will try to reserve the larger part of the meeting room here at Leslie and Gage for the planning meeting on March 21<sup>st</sup>.
  - e. John Airoidi and Jean Anderson showed what a cruiser shirt looks like. Several members seem interested in that style of shirt for a show shirt. T-shirts will also be available for the show. Women's V-neck shirts will be available for club members only; they will not be available via web order.
3. The Toxic Mopar Event will be June 18<sup>th</sup> at Uncle Dan's Tire Shop in Tigard, OR. This location is near Washington Square. The event will have food vendors. Other clubs from the Portland/Vancouver area and Tri-Cities are also welcome to attend.
4. Julie Schwartz stated that the Day of the Mustang cruise will be April 23<sup>rd</sup> due to April 17<sup>th</sup> also being Easter. The cruise will start at the Winery Center on Columbia Drive in Kennewick. It will go through Wallula Gap and Umatilla, then back to Kennewick for lunch at The Dugout on Hildebrand.

### NEW BUSINESS:

1. President Roseanne Davis reported that a young lady is so impressed by our new web site that she used it for a school project.
2. The Tri-City Camaro Club will hold its Power in the Park show on September 17<sup>th</sup> at Columbia Park. The Camaro Club has asked if we would sponsor a class at that show. Ken Meyers moved that we do so; Jim McQuown seconded that motion. The motion passed.
3. President Roseanne Davis announced that Gary and Jean Raabe are leaving the club due to illness. Their presence, enthusiasm, and hard work will be sorely missed.
4. The City of Pasco requests 7 convertibles to carry dignitaries in the Grand Old 4<sup>th</sup> Parade on July 4<sup>th</sup>. Hardtops are also welcome in the parade this year, but will need to be staged behind the convertibles.
5. Future PNWMC Events:
  - a. Julie Schwartz is setting up a club tour of a mammoth dig south of Kennewick. The tour will be a bus trip on May 14<sup>th</sup>. The dig is on/near Clodfelter Road.
  - b. A tour through the old townships of Hanford and White Bluffs was also suggested.
6. Julie Schwartz, Kevin Davis, and Roseanne Davis met recently with members from other Tri-Cities car clubs to discuss possible joint events. These meetings will continue.
7. Future shows in Hillsboro, Othello, and Elgin were mentioned.
8. John Airoidi asked if we wanted to use cruiser shirts as club shirts, as opposed to our show shirts, for wear at any kind of event anywhere. Let John, Roseanne Davis, or Jean Anderson know if you are interested.

Alan Anderson gave the Treasurer's report. Jim McQuown won \$45 in the 50/50 drawing. Alan Anderson moved to adjourn the meeting; Jim McQuown seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

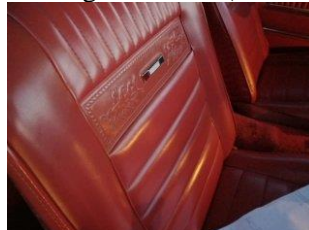
