 - a. The club had a great cruise to Bickleton on May 15th with 9 cars and 15 people. Bickleton had few bluebirds in sight, but the Blue Bird Café still serves great burgers. A few members toured the local museum. A few took the scenic route home by looping through the Horse Heaven Hills and Alderdale.
 - b. The Tri-City Camaro Club has invited us along on a cruise to McNary Dam on May 22nd. They will meet with the Hermiston car club there.
 - c. The Camaro Club has also invited us to ride with them as they cruise to the Stonehenge replica at the junction of US-97 and SR-14 on Sunday, June 12th.
