MUSTANG OF THE MONTH

Lindle Willey had a neat idea sometime around 1970. He decided to convert a Ford 390 to run on hydrogen. Then, he decided to replace the 289 in a Mustang coupe with the converted 390. He added a Willey hydrogen generator and a hydrogen fuel cell, plus a “fly by wire” control system. He put a Shelby nose piece on the front and really modified the interior, such as a joystick for steering. The car was shown at alternative fuel conventions in the 1970s and 1980s. The sign does not say how well it ran, but it would not have been picked up for the Lemay Family Collection Museum south of Puyallup if it didn't run at all.

AUGUST 16th MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 6:56 p.m. by President Roseanne Davis. Checks were presented to the Richland and Kennewick VFW posts from Spring Show proceeds. Bob (Kennewick) and Jerry (Richland) thanked us for the checks and explained how the money is used for veterans.

This meeting was held in the larger portion of the meeting room while another group used the smaller portion; therefore, the microphone and amplifier were not used. 2. Fall Show (Shahna Airoidi):
 - a. Shahna passed around copies of the Fall Show predicted budget, then explained some of the details behind the estimates. An income of \$5605 and expenses of \$4190 were predicted for an estimated profit of \$1415. Shahna also explained that reuse of old trophy plaques might reduce our predicted expenses. Nick Allen moved to approve the budget; Roger Anderson seconded that motion. The budget was approved.
 - b. Shahna also passed around some sign-up sheets for volunteers.
 - c. John Airoidi discussed the types and costs of apparel for club members. Tees, cruiser shirts, garage shirts, hoodies, and V-necks are available to members; only tes and hoodies will be available at the show. He passed out order sheets for the apparel; several members ordered some after the meeting.
3. Roseanne stated the prices will be going up on the blankets the club has considered ordering. The price will increase by \$3 on September 1st. Several members chose to order blankets after the meeting.
4. Roseanne reminded us that shows and other events are coming up soon in Bickleton (Sept 3), Cars and Coffee at Country Mercantile on Ava Drive (off Dallas Rd) on Sept 4, Wheelin' Walla Walla Weekend on Sept 10, Ponies in the Sun at Yakima on Sept 17-18.

Jim Compton reminded the members that he will need help getting the printed copies of the September newsletter distributed due to travel. Jeff Ziemer and Michelle volunteered to do this task again.

New Business:

1. Roseanne requested volunteers with convertibles for the Ben Franklin Fair Parade on August 20. Miss Tri-Cities need one car; Miss Juneteenth needs a second car. Steve Wallner, Grant Culley, and Nick Allen volunteered.
2. Roseanne reminded all of that election of 2023 officers is scheduled for the October 18 meeting. A few of the current officers would like to be replaced for next year.

Alan Anderson gave the Treasurer's Report. The 50/50 pot was won by Kevin Davis. Alan Anderson moved to adjourn the meeting. Several members seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 7:26 p.m.
