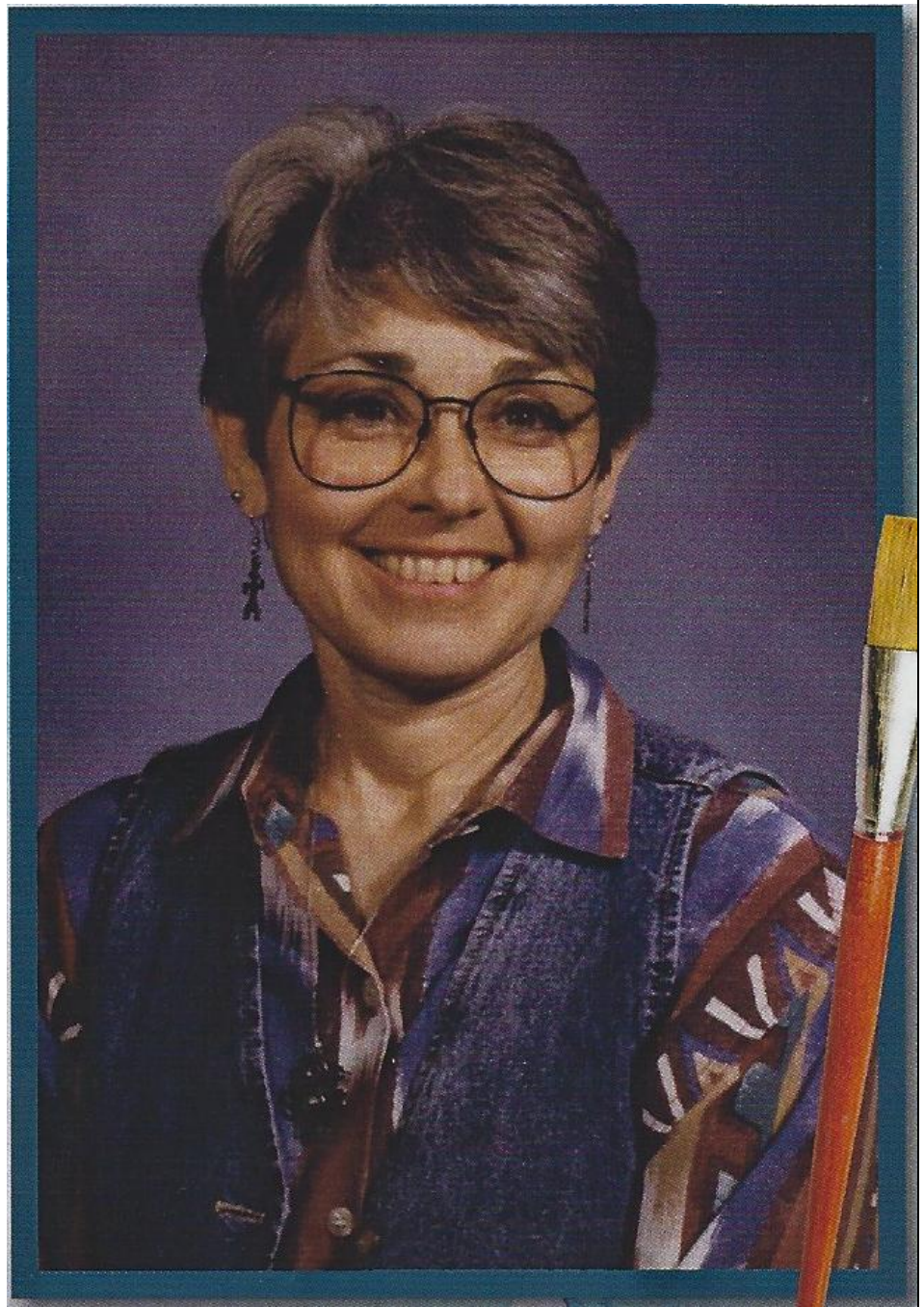

She graduated from the University of Utah Magna Cum Laude with a degree in Education in 1965. She married Bill in 1970; they have one daughter, Amy. She taught in the Denver and Cherry Creek area before she and Bill moved to Richland in 1986. She taught in the Richland schools until retiring in 1997.

She and Bill had quite an active life outside of work and the PNWMC. Marilyn knitted, sewed, gardened, played guitar, and painted with water colors. She and Bill were active in the Three Rivers Folklife Society, Sea Song Singalongs, and the Tumbleweed Music Festival. They traveled a lot. Marilyn was also an avid rider of roller coasters.

The office of club President will be decided at the November 15th meeting. Nobody present at the October 18th meeting volunteered to replace outgoing President Roseanne Davis. One member has stated his willingness to accept the position, but he has another commitment on our 3rd Tuesday of the month meeting date. The membership debated the pros and cons of moving the meeting to the 3rd Wednesday of the month. Corky Farrell then moved to table the discussion until the November 15th meeting to let people think about what would be best. This subject will be reopened at the November meeting. The club Bylaws do not dictate a particular meeting date, so no change to the Bylaws will be needed if we want to move meetings to Wednesdays.

OCTOBER 18th MEETING MINUTES

President Roseanne Davis called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Alex Maday was visiting as a guest of Jim McQuown. Alex has a white '12 convertible. Club member introductions were made. Roseanne announced that club member Marilyn Darke had passed away on October 9th. Jim McQuown moved to have the September meeting minutes approved as they appeared in the October Hoofprint; Ken Meyer seconded the motion. The minutes were approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Fall Show:
 - a. Roseanne thanked everyone for their contributions to putting on a great Fall Show at Columbia Crest Winery on October 2nd. It was a great way to end the series of shows at Columbia Crest.
 - b. We need a committee to review and select a new site for our Fall Shows. A sign-up sheet was sent around the room for volunteers.
 - c. Treasurer Alan Anderson gave a financial report for the Fall Show. Actual incomes for every facet of the show were above predictions. Expenses were near predictions. The net profit for the show was \$3107, well above the \$900 predicted in the budget. T-shirt sales led by John Airoidi were much better than predicted. Attendance was much better than predicted. We had 198 or 199 cars registered, 110 of whom registered on the day of the show. The previous Fall Show record was 194. We had 189 cars parked at the winery for this show.
 - d. Steve Wallner asked the club to consider buying some new radios for use at our Spring and Fall Shows. We also need to buy at least one new measurement wheel for use in laying out our show parking arrangements.
2. Roseanne announced that the club blankets ordered earlier should arrive just before the Prosser High School Homecoming on October 28th.
3. Roseanne thanked those who participated at the Pasco High School Homecoming on October 7th.
4. Roseanne reminded us of the Cars and Caffeine event coming up at Musser's on October 29th. The event will go from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
5. Events coordinator Julie Schwartz reminded us of some upcoming events:
 - a. The Prosser High School Homecoming will be on October 28th. She reported that we now have the convertibles requested for the event. Julie passed around a sign-up sheet for a dinner prior to the football game. The location and time for the dinner will be determined through e-mails to the volunteers beforehand.
 - b. Julie also passed around a sign-up sheet for the Veterans Day Parade in West Richland on November 5th. We were requested to provide 10 convertibles for dignitaries, but all of our vehicles are welcome to be in the parade. We will need to stage on Grosscup Road near Van Giesen St. starting around 7:00 a.m. The parade starts at 9:30 a.m. Expect e-mails with more details as the event approaches.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. We have received a request for a drive-by parade on October 28th. The parade is on behalf of an ill 4-yr-old boy who is a Hot Wheels fanatic. All we will do is drive past the house on one of the Redwood cul-de-sacs along Lynnwood Loop, which is next to Saint Street in Richland. We will do this in conjunction with the Tri-Cities Camaro Club. The Camaro Club will have its meeting at Dairy Queen on Jadwin starting at 4:00 p.m. We will cruise with them afterward, expecting the parade to be done before 7:00 p.m.
2. Thunder Alley motorcycle dealership is holding another Trunk or Treat event this year. It will be on Oct. 29th at the dealership on St. John's St. in west Pasco (near Road 100), starting at 1:00 p.m. If interested, meet there early to park and decorate your cars - and bring plenty of candy.
3. Another Trunk or Treat is planned in downtown Kennewick, also on the afternoon of Oct. 29th. Please let Julie know if you are interested in this event.
4. Kennewick will again have a Hometown Holidays Parade. This year's parade is on Dec. 3rd and we'll need to meet there at 8:00 a.m. This event is open to all of our cars. Please let Julie know if you plan to enter. We are requested to decorate our cars in a Christmas/winter theme. There will be some dignitaries and at least 7 convertibles have been requested. More information will be available at our Nov. 15th meeting.

5. Our December meeting will be a Christmas-like gathering once again. The Kennewick VFW post has once again offered to let us use its building for the evening. The building is on the south side of 10th Ave., just east of Washington St. near downtown. The meeting will be moved forward one week to December 13th to minimize conflicts with any members' plans for that season. We will have a pot luck dinner followed by a white elephant exchange.
6. John Airoidi suggested that we make a club shirt for members to wear anywhere anytime. It would have the club logo on the front and back. It would not be tied to a specific show as most our shirts have been, John suggested a cruiser shirt like the one for this year's Fall Show. Several members are interested in getting a shirt like this.
7. 2023 Officers Elections:
 - a. President: Roseanne Davis had previously stated that 2022 would be her last year as club President. Nobody present at the meeting volunteered to run for President. One absent member was reported to be willing to serve, but we would need to shift our meetings off of Tuesdays due to another commitment he has. The idea of shifting the club meetings to the 3rd Wednesday of the month was discussed for a while. Corky Farrell then moved that we table the possible movement and the election of the President to the November 15th meeting. That movement was seconded; the club voted to approve the motion.
 - b. Vice President: John Airoidi volunteered to stay on as Vice President. Ken Meyers also volunteered to take that position. The club voted to elect Ken into the position.
 - c. Secretary: Jim Compton volunteered to continue in the position; the club approved having him stay.
 - d. Treasurer: Alan Anderson had already made clear his intent to step down from this job. Julie Schwartz agreed to take this job for 1 year. The club voted to approve her as Treasurer.
 - e. Membership: Brad Culley volunteered to continue in this position. The club approved brad as Membership Director.
 - f. Spring Show Chair: Kevin Davis volunteered to chair this show again. The club approved Kevin as Spring Show Chair.
 - g. Fall Show Chair: Shahna Airoidi volunteered to continue as Fall Show Chair. The club approved Shahna for this position.
 - h. Newsletter editor: Jim Compton volunteered to continue in the position; the club approved having him stay.
 - i. Webmaster: Mande Wallner volunteered to continue in this job, working with Miles Thomas, but we were informed that Miles might request compensation for his work next year. The club voted to approve Mande as Webmaster.
 - j. Event Coordinator: Roseanne Davis volunteered to do this job. The club voted to approve her.

Alan Anderson gave the Treasurer's Report. Leslie Streeter won the 50/50 pot. John Airoidi moved to adjourn the meeting; Julie Schwartz seconded his motion. The meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

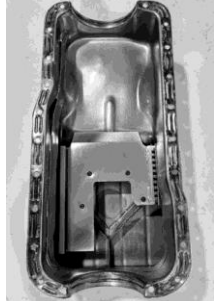
