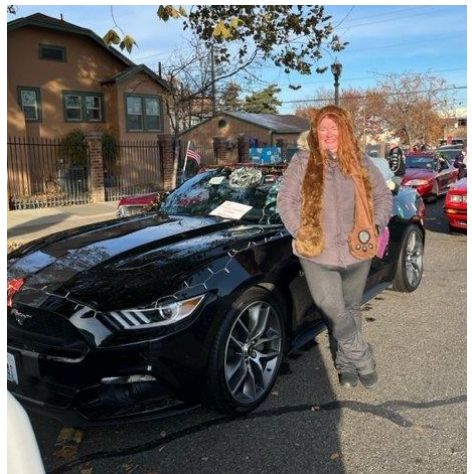
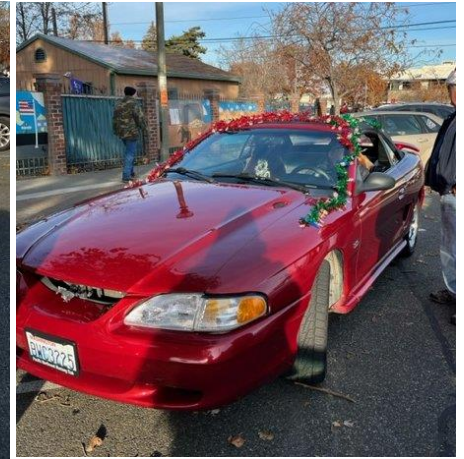

The club voted unanimously to shift future club business meetings to the 3rd Wednesday of each month, starting January 18, 2023. We will be changing information on our website and on our business cards as soon as possible to let the public know the correct meeting day. Arrangements with Round Table Pizza have already been made to secure the meeting location. The meeting time remains at 7:00 p.m. with earlier arrival encouraged for those wishing to eat there.

NOVEMBER 15th MEETING MINUTES

President Roseanne Davis called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. We had one visitor, Jason Maxwell's son. Pat Powell, a former member has requested help putting a top on his Mustang. Julie Schwartz moved to have the October 18 meeting minutes approved as written in the November Hoofprint. Nick Allen seconded the motion. The motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Roseanne thanked all the members whose convertibles came out for the Prosser Homecoming; we had an extra car. She also thanked the 4 members who went to the Trunk or Treat event at Thunder Alley to pass out candy. We estimate about 500 kids came to the event.
2. Roseanne said that the PNWMC blankets ordered earlier had arrived, but with an extra \$2/blanket shipping charge. She also said she had one extra for sale; it was purchased immediately by Kendell Millbauer.
3. Roseanne reminded us of the Wal-Mart Toy Drive going on at all 3 Tri-Cities Wal-Marts on Sunday, Dec. 4th. She passed around a sign-up sheet for those wanting to volunteer to help. We would be helping to accept gifts brought in by others. Other car clubs will be assisting, as well. All the toys will go to area hospitals.
4. Roseanne then resumed the Officers Election tabled from the October 17th meeting. Corky Farrell moved that we change our club business meeting date to the 3rd Wednesday of the month and that we accept Jim Millbauer as our 2023 President. Jim McQuown seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
5. Fall Show Chair Shahna Airoidi discussed the progress in getting a new Fall Show site. She discussed the trip that 4 of us took to Prosser to meet with Chamber of Commerce staff and see the proposed sites. Two plans were being looked at. If a site in Prosser is chosen, there might be some Chamber funds made available to help with our show. Mention was also made of possibly using McKenzie Park in Hermiston for the show. Goose Ridge Winery in West Richland apparently is not interested in being the site. Shahna stated that we have not heard back yet from the Prosser Chamber of Commerce.
6. John Airoidi discussed ordering club shirts that could be worn anywhere anytime and not related to a specific show. He plans on using a cruiser shirt such as we had for this year's Fall Show with blue areas on black. The member's name would be on the front; the PNWMC logo would be on the back. We will need at least 40 shirts ordered to keep the cost per shirt down. John stated that these shirts might cost \$50 each. Several members are interested. A sign-up sheet was sent around.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Miles Thomas did the major work to revise our website this past year. It was done free. He would like \$276 for his labors if we want him to continue in 2023. Julie Schwartz moved, and Ken Meyers seconded, to pay him this fee. The motion passed.
2. Donations to charities from the Fall Show profit was discussed next. Treasurer Alan Anderson had informed Roseanne that about \$2000-2500 would be about right for the total amount. Roseanne suggested that it be split between the 3 groups who received money last year – Veterans of Foreign Wars, Meals on Wheels, and Safe Harbor – and Service Peace Warriors. Discussion of several options ensued with Corky Farrell suggesting that the amounts could be \$400 to the VFW and \$700 each to Meals on Wheels, Safe Harbor, and Service Peace Warriors. Julie Schwartz moved to approve those amounts and Jim McQuown seconded her motion. The motion passed.
3. Spring Show Chair Kevin Davis organized a drawing to determine which 2 members' cars would appear on the 2023 Spring Show artwork. The cars drawn from a cap are Mike Cheney's 1978 2+2 T-Top and Grant Culley's 1994 Indy Pace Car Cobra. Kevin also announced that Spring Show planning meeting will start on Monday, January 16th at our usual Round Table Pizza location. Kevin also stated that the application to use the same Columbia Park area has been submitted.
4. Events Chair Julie Schwartz discussed the upcoming Holiday Parade in downtown Kennewick on December 3rd. We will need 3 or 4 convertibles for dignitaries, but all cars are welcome. We need to meet at the staging area at 8:00 a.m. to decorate our cars with a Christmas theme. The parade will start at 10:00. Julie passed around a sign-up sheet for volunteers. We do not plan to be throwing candy. Please do not dress like Santa.

5. Julie also stated that we have been requested to enter the evening Winterfest Parade in Benton City on December 10th. She passed around a sign-up sheet for volunteers. We will stage at 4:00 p.m. The parade starts at 5:00. The club has not been registered yet, pending knowledge of the number of cars entering.
6. Julie also stated that the December meeting is moved forward one week to Dec. 13th and will be at the Kennewick VFW Hall, 28 E. 10th St. in Kennewick. The meeting will start at 6:30 p.m. The club will provide the meat; attendees need to bring side dishes. We will also have a “white elephant” exchange; gifts should be less than \$10.
7. Jim Compton mentioned that a friend of his has a red ‘04 Mustang hardtop that he’d like to sell. It will need some work. Jason Maxwell asked the asking price. Jim said he’d contact the friend to get that price.

There was no Treasurer’s report this evening, nor was there a 50/50 drawing. The meeting adjourned at 7:55 p.m.

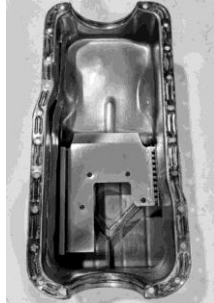
