**MUSTANG OF THE MONTH:
“THE HOUND,” JOSH BURCHARDT’S 2011 GT
PREMIUM 5.0 L COYOTE**

MUSTANG OF THE MONTH

I have here my dream car that I recently purchased in Nov 28th. Some details:

Name: The Hound Mustang: 2011 Ford Mustang GT (Premium)
Engine: 5.0L Gen 1 Coyote V8 Transmission: Tremec-MT82 Manual 6-Speed

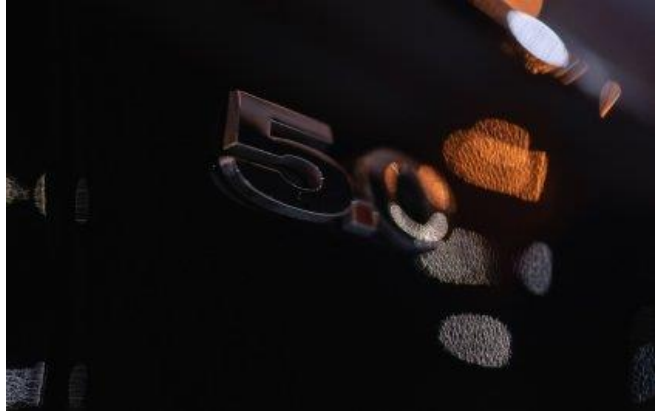
In 2011, this S197 body style got a bit of an upgrade in looks, drivetrain, and of course the legendary rebirth of one of Fords most insane motors yet, the Coyote.

Why a 2011? Personally, my first financed car was a 2011 3.7L Cyclone V6 and the body was amazing. I loved the feel and return of Carroll Shelby implementing Rear Independent Suspension and, for a V6, she did wonders. I then grew to learn of Coyote V8s and wanted one and the same sleek and “sexy” appeal of a body. Unfortunately, it was a short-lived car, as it blew a whole in the block. It was my goal to achieve my dream of obtaining a Black 2011 GT, with the classic Ford Red Interior.

The Coyote: It had been a while since Ford released a 5.0L motor, 1982, which made a degrading 157HP for a 2 Barrel pushrod style motor. Then came 2011 with the return of this 302ci 5.0L 32V DOHC beast of a motor made a WHOPPING 412HP to the flywheel. They have the strongest timing components, and crazy room for simple power additives and still are a force to be reckoned with. Make no mistake, the 5.0 is not a 6.2L LS/LT Chevy motor, but it is a motor that loves to suck in tons of air. Simply adding 8psi of forced air via Supercharger/Turbocharger is enough to add 150-180HP Gains on just stock internals, making this shortblock a sleeping force to never look over.

In the end, I anticipate to have this a Street/Drag build, one I can comfortably drive daily, but still blast the doors in style, volume, and power. These S197 Body Styles in the 2010-Present will remain my favorite, mainly for the girth and aggressive, sleek, and modern-retro appearance. I saw this Coyote on the lot, embracing my dreams, and the dealership should have never let this beast now named The Hound, out of its cage.

JANUARY 18th MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Jim Millbauer. Introductions were made; Josh Burchardt was attending his first club meeting. Ken Meyers moved to approve the November 15 meeting minutes as printed in the January Hoofprint; Alan Anderson seconded. The minutes were approved. A sign-up sheet was passed around by Jim Compton for Mustang of the Month volunteers. Members were reminded that 2023 dues are now due.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Spring Show (Kevin Davis):
 - a. The show will be on May 27-28 at the east end of Columbia Park. The next planning meeting will be on January 30. [Ed. Note: Please see Events List for complete schedule of planning meetings. Three are on Tuesdays.]
 - b. The predicted budget was discussed. It was based on 42 classes with 3 trophies per class. A class sponsorship is \$80. The predicted attendance was 150 cars, equally split between pre-registered and day-of-show. We predict a profit of about \$2500. Corky Farrell moved to accept the predicted budget; Jim McQuown seconded. The predicted budget was approved.
2. Fall Show (Shahna Airoidi): Planning meetings have also started for the Fall Show. These are being held following each Spring Show planning meeting. Shahna is requesting ideas for a new official name for this show. The show will be October 1st at the Vintner's Village in Prosser.
3. Club Shirts (John Airoidi): John wants to collect money for the shirts either tonight or at the February 15 meeting. The shirts will cost \$50 each. We have orders for 24, but need at least 40 for a better price. The shirts will have the red, white, and blue club logo embroidered on the back with the member's name embroidered on the front. John also asked for interest in similar caps; several members requested caps. The caps will count toward the shirt minimum order.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Mustang Club of America (Jim Millbauer): Jim Millbauer asked if we wanted to become a regional club of the MCA. We would get insurance for our shows, window placards, and other benefits. To do this, we need at least 10 our members to be MCA members; we have a few at this meeting.
2. Corporate Sponsors Jim Millbauer): Jim Millbauer asked if we wanted to try getting corporate sponsorship for the club. Some of the west-side clubs have sponsors, usually a local Ford dealer. Jim is trying to discuss the matter with Mario at Corwin Ford. Denchel Ford might be interested, also.
3. Kennewick's Classy Chassis Show (Jim Millbauer): Jim Millbauer and Roseanne Davis attended a meeting regarding the Classy Chassis show to be held in downtown Kennewick on May 6. The City of Kennewick would like help from the car clubs to plan this annual show. Let Roseanne or Jim know if you are interested.
4. Events (Roseanne Davis): Roseanne went over a list of shows being held regionally for members interested in attending. The shows are Ponies in the Sun (Sept 17), Sunnyside High School (Apr 22), Ye Old Car Club (Mar 18), Camaro Club dam cruise (May 21), Kennewick Classy Chassis (May 6), and Power in the Park (Sept 24). Jim Compton added that regional Mustang Club shows known to be planned for this year include Mustang Wranglers (June 10), Mustangs Northwest's Roundup (July 16), Kitsap Mustang Club (July 30), Pierce Count Mustang Club (Aug 13), and Pacific Cascade Mustang Club (Aug 20 – tentative). National Mustang Day is also on April 17, a Monday this year.
5. Roseanne is also still talking with other car clubs about resumption of the Show for Hunger, a major food drive started by the late Chuck Wolfe. The next meeting will be January 28 at the Country Mercantile on Ava Drive in south Richland.
6. Jim Millbauer requested that the members send him or any other officer any ideas to be put on the meeting agenda.
7. Bill Schwartz stated that former member Bill Scheppe sends his greetings to the club.
8. Josh Burchardt is helping the local Mopar club set up its show. He will be a liaison between the 2 clubs. He also said that Vanguard Academy in Moses Lake is also putting on a show.
9. Corky Farrell mentioned that he will be going to the annual Mustang show in Sturgis, SD Aug 29 – Sept 3. Let him know if you are also interested. Corky reminds all of us to make your Sturgis reservations EARLY or you'll be out of luck.

The Treasurer's report was given. John Airoidi won the 50/50 pot. Grant Culley moved to adjourn the meeting; Julie Schwartz seconded that motion. The meeting adjourned at 7:40 p.m.

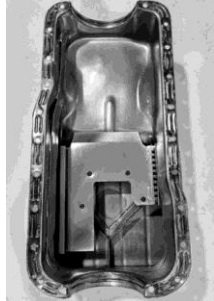
